Short Bio André Arends

André Arends (1961) is a professionally trained musician, composer, and sound designer. As a professional saxophonist he played in a wide range of bands, orchestras and contemporary music ensembles of which the Aurelia Saxophone Quartet, based in The Netherlands, became the most well-known. Around the year 2000, André stopped as an active performer and started working as a composer, sound designer. He worked with orchestras like the NJFO and the NBE, and chamber music ensembles like De Volharding. Around the same time, he became interested in electronic music including EDM. André is an active member of the Ableton Music community in the Benelux.

In 2009, he entered the academic world and, subsequently, in 2013 he received his master's degree Theatre Studies at the University of Amsterdam. In his research, André investigated the sound dramaturgical strategies of Glenn Gould's radio work *The Idea of North* premiered in 1967 on the CBC radio network. Now, André is a PhD candidate at the University of Groningen. He investigates the phenomenon of the disembodied voice in arts and media, and, in particular, the impact of listening to disembodied voices in electronic music.
